Coach Green is a 15-year veteran coach spending the last 8 seasons at Oak Grove. Coach Green is married to Meagan Green for 14 years. Career Accomplishments

Coach Green has been a part of 7 straight semifinal appearances from 2014-2021. Our team went to the finals from 2018-2020 winning it in back-to-back years in 2019 and 2020. In the 3 years that we went to the State Championship in the Semifinals our defense pitched 2 shutouts and in the other only gave up 14 points.

What makes coaching High School Football in Louisiana special?

I am born and raised in Louisiana and am very proud of the state that I call home. I have lived in South, Central, and North Louisiana. Shane Savoie - St. Thomas More - Offensive Coordinator

Coach Savoie is a 22-year veteran coach spending the last 18 years at his Alma Mater, St Thomas More. Coach Savoie has been married to Cristy Savoie for 20 years. They have four children, Elijah (17) and Emma (15) both students at STM and Ella (11), and Ezekiel (5) both students at St. Cecilia.

Career Accomplishments

In fifteen seasons as the offensive coordinator at STM, Savoie has helped lead the cougars to 147 wins and 37 losses. In that time span the Cougar Offense has averaged 38.3 Points/Game. Which including two season over 50 Pts/Game (59.2-2018, 50.3-2020) and 4 seasons over 40 Pts/Game (46.9-2014, 41.9-2019, 41.3-2021, 41.1-2015). The cougar offense was a vital part of 11 District Titles over the fifteen season, 5 State Title Appearances, and three State Championships (2017, 2019, 2020). Names to the Max Emfinger All-American Game coaching staff in 2014. Named to the LHSCA I-10 Bowl Coaching staff in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2021.
